



## CRE SUMMER CAMPS HEALTH AND SAFETY ADDENDUM 2020

Revised 4.24.20

### 1. IMPLEMENT A ROBUST EVALUATION PROCESS.

- Anyone entering camp must be temperature free for 14 days pre-camp and have not travelled overseas or been exposed to or in contact with anyone testing positive for the COVID-19. As we did in the H1N1 times, we will have a separate screening station at the camp bridge.
- The Senior Patrol leader and Scoutmaster will be responsible for daily temperature and health screening of each scout and this will be required reporting at the daily flag ceremony. The camp will furnish each troop a no-touch temperature scanner or thermometer to be returned at checkout.
- Staff will undergo additional training and ultra-awareness.

### 2. DINING.

- To maintain additional separation, depending on number of scouts attending, meals may be served in staged dining with the camp split into two teams (a la red and blue) for meals.
- To maintain better hygiene, outside of program skills areas or backwoods rendezvous, all campsite dining is suspended.

### 3. ADDITIONAL SANITIZING.

- The Dining hall will be sanitized and wiped down after each meal, including tables, benches and doors. Disinfectant spray. All self-serve bars will have hand sanitizer.
- All non-natural surfaces in program areas will be sanitized each day.
- All latrines and bathrooms will be spray sanitized each day.
- Following Saturday checkout, each campsite will be spray sanitized.
- Hand washing and sanitizing will be strictly enforced throughout camp, and additional facilities such as a water buffalo and constructed hand washing station will be placed outside of the dining hall. This will also be sanitized daily.

### 4. PROGRAM AND CAMP OPERATION ADJUSTMENTS FOR SOCIAL DISTANCING.

- All programs will endeavor to keep social distancing. Camp is not open to visitors.
- Opening and closing campfires/amphitheater are not open to parents. Depending on the number of scouts in camp, we ask for spread social distancing. If the attendance is too large to do that, the campfires are cancelled. In their place, Commissioners are to assist each troop throughout the week with their own in-site campfire. The Tap out can move to the parade field.
- No visitors or executive board meeting at camp. It brings in too many variables and the benefits do not outweigh the risks.
- Camp staff are encouraged to enjoy their night off on the property but are not required to stay. Council staff will take precautions coming and going. Camp operations will require deliveries and repair – staff will sanitize behind them.

### 5. IN THE EVENT OF A POTENTIAL POSITIVE COVID CASE.

- Any individual showing signs of COVID will be promptly quarantined in the health lodge, with a contact to their parents/family and arrangements made to take the individual to Valley Health for testing hopefully for rapid results.
- An immediate call will be made by our camp physician to the Lord Fairfax Health District to report the potential case and to receive their instructions.
- Hopefully we have rapid testing results. If clear, all clear. If not:
  - a. Absent instructions from the health department the troop with the potential case will be quarantined to their campsite. Food will be delivered to the site. Site will be disinfected.
  - b. Camp programming will cease, and we will begin attempts to send remaining Scouts home.
