We are committed to the health and safety of our Scouting community. Our outdoor camping program is a proven experience in growing competent caring committed adults.

We are still on track to offer our summer camp programs at this time.

We are committed to health and safety The SARS CoV-2(COVID-19) situation continues to evolve quickly and Shenandoah Area Council BSA and its partners are closely monitoring global developments and following the advice of public health authorities, medical experts and local officials.

Our camps consistently receive among the highest inspection scores and we have stringent health and safety protocols in place. We also have a comprehensive plan that outlines protocols for managing illness and closely follow the guidance of public health officials. In light of COVID-19, our camps will be operating at elevated cleaning and sanitation levels. Among the procedures currently in place include:

- Upgraded training for all of our Staff to prevent the spread of illness.
- In addition to the medical recheck at camp arrival, anyone entering the property will receive a health screening completed by all people to check for illness before they may enter camp.
- Extensive cleaning and sanitation, disinfectant in all areas.
- Regular communication with Scouts regarding how to prevent illness, including mandatory daily troop operated screening.
- Hand-washing stations and sanitizing wipes will be located throughout camp.
- Medical health lodge staffed 24/7 and stocked with supplies and medications to treat a variety of illnesses.
- In the unlikely event of a potential positive COVID-19 case, we will follow the directions of the health department, which may include quarantine pending test results.
- Limitations on visitors/family night. We normally welcome family and visitors, during these times we have determined this produces an additional health risk to our scouts and visitors are not permitted at camp.

Make your reservation with confidence. Refund/Cancellation Policy: We recognize that circumstances are constantly changing, and a Scout is helpful. If your circumstances change prior to your arrival day at camp, we believe a Scout is honest and as long as we have received your written request prior to your arrival day we will waive all cancellation fees and will provide a complete refund. (This does not apply to pre-ordered custom shirts or merchandise).

Criteria for scouts and leaders coming to camp. We are continuously monitoring the bulletins regarding the COVID-19 and take preventive measures as recommended by the health authorities, as well as intensifying our normal very high standards of hygiene at camp.

If any camp participant within 14 days of camp arrival date has travelled overseas or been exposed to or in contact with anyone testing positive for the COVID-19 or has not been temperature-free within 14 days of your arrival date, you may request a full refund as **you will not be permitted into camp**. In doing a good turn, this individual should be self-isolating.
